#### About Muktangan

Muktangan, started in 2003, as an innovative model of education within the mainstream Government schools providing quality, child-friendly, inclusive English-medium schooling to thousands of underserved children in Mumbai. We are truly "Education for the Community, by the Community", developing teachers from the same neighbourhoods as the students, who then become empowered change agents.

This mainstay approach has proved fundamental to our sustainability and relevance. Children experience a developmentally appropriate curriculum, low student-teacher ratio and are constantly encouraged to be active learners. Our curriculum promotes the construction of knowledge by the children themselves, rather than passive rote learning. Facilitating this process are the Muktangan teachers who are nurtured at our Teacher Education Centre.

Besides academic excellence, all round development of every child is ensured through the Holistic (Art & Craft, Music & Drama, Dance and Sports) and Socio-Emotional (Counselling, Pastoral Care, Career Guidance and Personality Development) Departments.

As of April 2016, Muktangan spans 7 Englishmedium Municipal Corporation of Greater Mumbai (MCGM) Schools and a "Teacher Education Centre" in Mumbai, educating 3,159 children taught by 466 community teachers. The schools and education centre are integrated together and comprise the Muktangan Educational & Resource Centre.

Muktangan has also collaborated with partners like the Magic Bus India Foundation, Antarang Foundation, Music & Measures and The Pomegranate Workshop to endow our students with an overall holistic and comprehensive form of education

Muktangan strives to be at the forefront of effectively fulfilling national and state-mandated policies. The Muktangan Educational Resource Centre (MERC) is an outcome of thirteen years of experience and expertise to advancing the quality of education. MERC spreads its pedagogical footprint across other institutions and the teaching community by organizing weekly training workshops through the year.

The Muktangan Educational Resource Centre has also initiated an Outreach Program to improve the quality of education in rural Maharashtra. We have collaborated with the Learning Space Foundation, a NGO; where our faculty train their rural facilitators in our pedagogy for pre-primary school (Early Childhood Education). Together we have worked in various Schools and Anganwadis in the Wada District of Maharashtra.

## \*\*Cighlights 2015-2016

Muktangan teacher trainees who come from the local communities undergo a rigorous three year 'pre-service' and 'in-service' program; where they learn through an active-constructive approach and undergo many hours of classroom internship. In the academic year 2015-2016 more than 400 applications were received for our Foundation and Early Childhood Development (ECD) course of which 87 trainees were selected.

During the academic year a new 8<sup>th</sup> grade class was added to 6 Muktangan schools. As on June 2015, six of the seven schools have reached the 8<sup>th</sup> grade resulting in the start of secondary schooling for an additional 235 students. Our original pilot school which extends from KG to the 10<sup>th</sup> grade had its 3<sup>rd</sup> batch of 10<sup>th</sup> graders appear for the SSC Board Examination. The 6 remaining schools will add a 9<sup>th</sup> grade in June 2016 and a 10<sup>th</sup> grade in June 2017.

Our third batch of sixty 10th graders from our pilot school including 32 girls, prepared for the Secondary School Certificate (SSC) Examination. 2015-2016 was our third year in succession where 100% of our students passed the SSC Board Examination which included six children with certified learning disorders. 80% of this batch of students passed with a 1st class and above.

Ms. Sayali Sanas, 10<sup>th</sup> Grade student of our GMP School secured 94.8% in the SSC Board Examinations and was the overall topper among all students from the Municipal Schools across Mumbai. Over the last three academic years 154 students have graduated the 10th grade of which 86% scored a first class.

Muktangan in partnership with the Antarang Foundation launched a One Year 'World of Exposure' programme for 8<sup>th</sup> graders across our seven schools; the aim was to facilitate career exploration and career decision making in a hands-on, practical and exciting manner. The programme first made the students aware of their interests through interest inventories and then focused on certain career strands covering the types of jobs, qualifications & personality type requirements. The students were also exposed to guest lectures by industry experts and taken on field trips to places of work, after which the students were given time to reflect on their suitability for the career strand. These were industry experts from Tata Starbucks and Moshe's Restaurants (for Hospitality); The Times of India and Whistling Woods for Film and Television (for Media); Amar Chitra Katha Publications (for Art); Metropolis Healthcare (Medical Lab Technology); Yes Bank and HDFC Bank (for Banking & Finance); to name a few.



### Cighlights 2015-2016

Muktangan Education Resource Centre (MERC) conducted over twenty workshops on diverse topics for the teachers from the NGO community and schools. The topics included 'Making Mathematics Meaningful to Children', 'Connecting Social Studies to the World Outside the Classroom', 'Child Sexual Abuse and Awareness', 'Empathetic Teaching', 'Scientific Investigation', 'Story Telling and Reading', 'Library Usage Skills' to name a few. Over 500 teachers from 33 different organizations and some parents benefited from our workshops.

Muktangan along with Learning Space Foundation trained and supported the rural teachers and workers of 25 Schools and 25 Anganwadis in Wada District of Maharashtra. This was the third year of this outreach programme. The success of the last two years has resulted in a request from the Project Officer of the Integrated Child Development Services Scheme (Wada Block) to take up a larger project with a wider scope of Anganwadis. The proposition was to have structured training workshops for more than 400 Anganwadi workers; of which 50 would then be shortlisted to further tutor them to become trainers themselves. The scope and operational practicality of this approach is currently under discussion between the involved stakeholders.

In partnership with the Maharashtra State Council of Education Research and Training (MSCERT), Muktangan has planned to launch Project ACOTE - Active Constructivism Oriented Teacher Education Programme. This programme will be pilot tested at 10 D.Ed colleges in Maharashtra. The objective is to create a learning organisation model i.e. create a learning organisation in teacher education colleges. This process started with a visit by the Secretary of Education (Government of Maharashtra), Mr Nandkumar and officials from the MSCERT to the Muktangan ecosystem; A Memorandum of Understanding was signed for the ACOTE Project in April 2016. Muktangan would act as a knowledge partner and conduct interventions at three levels: Leadership development for the College Principals, Constructivist Pedagogy for the College Faculty and Skill development for student teachers.



#### \*\*Cighlights 2015-2016

In March 2016 Muktangan entered into a partnership with the Tata Institute of Social Sciences to become their HUB partner for the B. Voc in Early Child Development. This course would provide training to new entrants and now give an opportunity to all to get a formal joint certification for the Early Child Development Programme. This course envisions creating a cadre of professionally trained workers in the child development sector having sound knowledge of child development and skills to work in adoption centres, institutional care and Integrated Child Development Schemes.

Muktangan has a dynamic internship programme with interns from leading schools and colleges from India and overseas, like Oxford University, Bath Spa University, Azim Premji University, NMIMS College and Tata Institute of Social Sciences participating in our school and teacher education programmes. It has been a mutually enriching experience for our students & teachers and also the interns.

### Teacher Training

In addition to the Early Childhood Development Course Muktangan teacher trainees undergo a rigorous one year Foundation Program (preservice), which has been carefully designed in line with the principles of the "National Curriculum Framework, 2009". Trainees learn through an "Active Constructive" approach using case study and group discussions, debates and role plays to understand the efficacy of this process and undergo 350 hours of classroom internship.

To ensure proficiency development on pedagogy after the Foundation Program (pre-service), Muktangan teachers undergo a two year part-time In-Service training and continuous professional development thereafter. Modules include all subjects in the state board syllabus, early childhood, school librarianship, special education, pastoral care and more. Challenging concepts like "lesson planning", "differentiated learning" and "subject specific pedagogy" are learnt through weekly "Curriculum Understanding and Design" meetings where our teacher educators and teachers work together to design classroom learning experiences for the children.



## School Brogramme

Muktangan has adopted a constructivist curricular approach providing programmes of experiential active learning for children. Our students are actively involved in a process of meaning and knowledge construction, building on their prior knowledge. The students, rather than learning by rote, apply critical thinking skills and are motivated and independent learners. We respect the fact that children learn in different ways and provide a diverse range of learning experiences suited to their differing interests and abilities. In the classroom the children sit in three groups, each with their own teacher and resources. The student-teacher ratio is low enabling ongoing one-to-one interactions between teacher and student. Thus the teacher is seen as a partner in the learning process and not its director. In the 21st century, children need to develop skills of collaboration rather than competition to keep up with the available knowledge.

At Muktangan, our overarching approach is that all the stakeholders including management, faculty members, teachers, children and parents are all learners, learning from one another. At Muktangan, 'learning and growing together' is not just a tagline – it is a way of life!

#### Outreach Programme

Muktangan Education Resource Centre is the result of our Pedagogy Programme which has been tried and tested over these 13 years. The principal purpose is to share our learning and good practices with the teaching community across the country and thus ourselves learn the adaptations required for our model to remain effective in changing environments and contexts. Teachers from different schooling backgrounds are invited to our Education Centre. All subjects are learnt through active learning methods; so that teachers use their reflections and develop a similar method of teaching children in their classrooms. Our pedagogy focuses on self reflections and practical implementation. Muktangan's Outreach Programme includes collaborating with NGOs, lowfee paying schools, government schools and individuals in both urban and rural areas of Maharashtra.

#### Awards & Representations

Muktangan's Founder-Trustee, Mrs. Elizabeth Mehta was awarded The Member of the Most Excellent Order of the British Empire (MBE) in June 2015 in Queen's Birthday Honours List, for her exemplary work in education through the years and for setting up the Muktangan Schools Network for the under-served children.

In 2015, Muktangan was rated as one of top 10 NGOs to work for by Great Places to Work India. Not-for-profit organizations underwent the Great Place to Work Assessment and were evaluated through two different lenses. First, employees of these organizations were surveyed using a comprehensive questionnaire, called the Trust Index, to understand their sentiments. The survey was administered to over 3897 employees from different NGOs, making this research one of the largest studies in the country of workplace culture in the social sector. Secondly, the organizations' people management practices were assessed using the people practice framework called Culture Audit developed by the Institute.

Mrs. Anuradha Varadkar, of Muktangan's science faculty did us proud this year by securing the 188<sup>th</sup> rank out of over 30,000 participants in the Science track at the Centre for Teacher Accreditation (CENTA) Teaching Professionals' Olympiad, held in December 2015. Anuradha joined the Muktangan family in the year 2004 as a teacher trainee and has held various roles and responsibilities over these years.

Mrs Elizabeth Mehta and Ms Gauravi Jadhav, the Head of Muktangan's Early Childhood Education division attended the UNESCO-organised Asia Education Summit in Bangkok in February 2016 on Flexible Learning Strategies for Out-of-School Children. Mrs. Mehta presented a paper on 'Individualised and Innovative Assessment Strategies'; where she addressed the summative assessment systems in India that disengage learners and de-motivate them from continuing education. She illustrated how Muktangan's Development-Oriented Assessment System functions and its focus on the individual child's learning levels.

#### Awards & Representations

In 2015, Muktangan gained momentum in advocating our program with the Government of Maharashtra. The senior leadership team of the Maharashtra State Council of Education Research and Training along with Education Secretary visited Muktangan in August 2015. This resulted in Ms. Jumana Rampurawala, Coordinator of Teacher Education, being appointed as member of a team constituted for the revision of the D.Ed syllabus and curriculum. She was the sole representative from the NGO sector among the team of government educationalists and officials.

To achieve the goals of Pragat Shaikshanik Maharashtra (PSM); the Government Maharashtra organised a two day Development Partners Meeting at Lonavala in October 2015. Our senior faculty heads, Mrs. Sushma Jagtap and Mrs. Dymphena Dias represented Muktangan at this meeting. Various NGOs and Corporates presented their views on Teacher Development and Management; Curriculum and Pedagogy; Role of Community etc. to name a few. Muktangan made a presentation on its Teacher Education Model and how we could help in teacher development and management.

#### Muktangan in the Media

Under a programme called Muktpath Muktangan students took part in two 'Design for Change' Community Research Projects. The 8<sup>th</sup> grade students of Love Grove Pumping MPS school with the help of local craftsmen in Worli, Mumbai constructed need based models that could solve practical problems such as open gutters, mosquitoes and garbage in their community. The 9<sup>th</sup> graders at our GMP school conducted a selfdeveloped survey research at their school to find solutions to two glaring problems in their immediate environment i.e. 'Food Wastage' & 'Inappropriate Language in Bathrooms'. Both the projects were displayed as part of an external presentation to visitors through an internal event coined Muktpath. These two projects were reported in Mumbai's leading newspaper - 'DNA' 'The Daily News & Analysis'.

#### Visitors

Ben and Angie visited Muktangan's Dr Ambedkar Primary School where they interacted with our third and fourth grade students. Being a primary teacher herself, Angie from the Withycombe Raleigh Primary School introduced our students to her home and school environment through an interactive power-point presentation. The presentation also included messages from the students of Angie's class in Exeter, United Kingdom. Angie was accompanied by Ben Cornish, a professional juggler who introduced the idea and profession of juggling to the students, and followed it up with a short performance. He also spent half an hour teaching our fourth grade students how to juggle using scarves.

In March 2016, two teachers of the Plashet School in London visited the Muktangan schools and Teacher Education Centre as part of the British Council Connecting Classrooms Initiative. The initiative involved a collaborative project on "biodiversity in a drop of water". It was worked on by 8<sup>th</sup> graders of Muktangan Elphinstone School, Mumbai and the Stem Club Members of the Plashet School, London. Our science department lead and subject faculty also visited the Plashet School.

Ms Maria Davydenko and Ms Sitalaxmi from the American Consulate Library; showcased the movie 'The Big Dream' and conducted a discussion on the discrimination against girls in fields such as Science and Math and other male-dominated disciplines. This was part of the film festival held in May for all in-service teachers in order to enhance their exposure about various events and issues across the world.

#### Way forward

Muktangan is one of the model NGO Institutes working in the space of mainstream education in India. The innovative pedagogy & robust programme model has got wide visibility and acceptability with time. Muktangan has been taking continuous steps to ensure a sustainable program & a financial model. Muktangan has been working to develop community teachers into faculty & leadership roles for long term sustenance of the school program. Each school will have its pool of dedicated subject faculty and therefore each school will be an independent HUB for the Teacher and School Programme. As a result it will free up significant bandwidth of the more qualified lead faculty which will significantly enhance our Outreach Programme post 2018.

The Early Childhood Development (ECD) space is of importance to Muktangan's overall advocacy. From an overall strategic standpoint we have a clear four year roadmap, starting with design and development of a high quality pre-service Early Childhood Development program and a low cost pedagogy training toolkit. This toolkit will further be pilot tested on minimum three non Muktangan preschools before 2017-2018. Our goal will be for our pre-service course to get direct recognition by the government or an affiliation with a recognized University.

Muktangan has set up a core team to ensure sustainability of our Teacher and School Programme over the next five years. The core team consists of highly experienced individuals, each having more than ten years of professional experience. The core team has also been working on a long term strategy for financial sustenance which includes tapping new Indian and International donors. This has moved in the right direction with two to three new corporate donors being added every year.
